PEER student committee (<u>https://peer.berkeley.edu/about/peer-student-committee</u>) is hosting its second Research series on March 15th 12pm to 1pm. Here's the event description -

The second PSC Future of Research Series Seminar of the quarter is where we will be discussing the **learnings from the recent earthquake that struck Türkiye and Syria on February 6, 2023**. The seismic sequence caused widespread damage and destruction, and sadly, more than 46,000 people have lost their lives. The seminar will be led by Dr. Robb Moss, Professor at California Polytechnic State University San Luis Obispo, who is leading the GEER advanced reconnaissance team to assess on-site conditions in Türkiye and help organize subsequent teams to target specific hazards. Dr. Moss will present a broad overview of the events and the lessons that the earthquake has taught our earthquake engineering community.
