Call for applications – 2020-2021 Internal Fellowships for UC Davis Continuing Academic Graduate Students. This competition annually awards over 125 fellowships valued at approximately \$3 million.

APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS FOR CONTINUING STUDENTS

Students must submit an online <u>2020-2021 Internal Fellowship Application</u> to be considered for these fellowships:

- 1. Create an account. (You must create a new account each year.)
- 2. Click "Start New Application"
- 3. Click "Create Application"
- 4. Click "Open Application"
- 5. Review the terms and conditions.
- 6. Start application. (The next time you login, you will be taken to an "Application Management" page. Please click the "Application for Continuing Student Fellowship" link to return to your application. DO NOT click on the "Start New Application" link.)
- 7. Students indicate their interest in being considered for nomination by checking all fellowships for which they are eligible and by explaining how they are eligible for each of the fellowships. Descriptions of the fellowships offered during this competition may be found here.

<u>DUE DATE</u>: The application for 2020-2021 UC Davis Internal Fellowships for Continuing Academic Graduate Students is due prior to 11:59:00 p.m. PST on **January 15, 2020**. (See <u>deadlines</u>)

All applications must include a "Statement of Purpose" essay and "Personal History Statement" essay.

All applicants must obtain three (3) Letters of Recommendation – Students register their recommenders via the online application and their recommenders must submit their letters **DIRECTLY** through the online system. For continuing students, your graduate program cannot fully review your application until all three of your recommenders have submitted their letters of reference. Therefore, it is your responsibility to ensure that your three recommenders have electronically submitted their letters of recommendation. Do not wait until the day the application is due (January 15th) to register your three recommenders. **We recommend you register your three recommenders no later than December 20th.** Once you initiate an application, you may immediately register your recommenders and then work on completing the remainder of the application. Recommenders must submit their letters of recommendation for you by January 18,

All applicants must upload a copy of their UC Davis transcript. You may also ask your graduate program coordinator for an unofficial copy of your transcript to upload into the system.

NOTIFICATION OF DECISION: Official notification of UC Davis internal fellowship offers are sent directly to students via the e-mail address used in the online application, with a copy to their <u>Graduate Program Coordinator</u>. The first round of notifications will be e-mailed approximately 60 days after the January 15th fellowship deadline. Because fellowship offers are made in multiple rounds through October 1st, <u>you will NOT be notified if your application was unsuccessful</u>.
