AIAA Conference at UC Davis

The American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics (AIAA) at UC Davis will host our first Aerospace Conference on March 25-26th 2023 here in Davis! We will have speakers from industries like NASA, Boeing, and Lockheed Martin, along with professionals such as the CEO of G-SPACE Inc. and the AIAA Executive Director. There will be student presentations from different universities and high schools where students will be presenting on their STEM related projects. We will also have a variety of technical and non-technical workshops, and host a tour with Professor Christiana Harvey where she will discuss her work on bird flight aerodynamics in collaboration with the UC Davis Raptor Center. Message from the current student members of the Campus Judicial Board:

On behalf of the Office of Student Support and Judicial Affairs (OSSJA), we are pleased to announce the start of the Campus Judicial Board recruitment process for the 2023-2024 academic year. The CJB is a unique student group on campus that works directly with OSSJA to resolve disputed cases of academic and social misconduct through formal hearings and/or advise students who have been reported to our office. We play an integral role in the disciplinary process by bringing our perspectives as students and helping participants understand and prepare for the hearing.

Being on the CJB is a great way to work on real cases that impact students' lives and sharpen active listening, questioning, and evidence evaluation skills. Members learn how to develop peer counseling and communication through their role as advisors. CJB members are also key sources of information for students by conducting outreach at events and on social media.

There is a mandatory in-person Saturday training (5 hours) in September 2023 and one-hour check-in/training meeting each month during the quarter via Zoom. A CJB member may spend anywhere from 1-4 hours (more hours if they are volunteering to serve on multiple hearings in a month) per month on work related to CJB. It is not a major time commitment.

2022-23 Spring Graduate Studies Travel Awards

Graduate students who have traveled, or will be traveling, to present at meetings of nationally and internationally recognized professional societies between January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023 may now apply for the Graduate Studies Spring Travel Award. The award is for students who are near the completion of their degree who have not previously received the award. Students must be in good academic standing, registered in full-time status, and have a minimum GPA of 3.0. The application deadline for students is March 17, 2023. The application has moved online and should be submitted by students through [InfoReady](#), an application platform hosted by UC Davis. Awards will be announced the week of May 15, 2023. Students can reference the [InfoReady Applicant Guide](#) for detailed instructions on using the application system.

Programs will rank all of their candidates in InfoReady. The top two candidates will continue forward for review by Graduate Studies.

The Graduate Student Advisor to the Dean and Chancellor (GSADC) is a current graduate student representative serving as a voice for graduate students with UC Davis administration. Job Description:

This course examines how various religious traditions deal with the ethical dilemmas involved in healthcare. Topics covered include the end of life, caring for the sick, humanity's relationship to the natural world, growing up, birth, pregnancy, gender, and conception. The course investigates how different religious traditions categorize, understand, and encourage ethical actions in a given context. It also examines how religious ideas can, at times, complicate the process of providing individual healthcare as well the design and delivery of public health programs.

The TA will lead discussion sections, attend lectures (MWF 12:10-1:00), do the readings, and grade the assignments, hold two office hours a week, and attend regular meetings with instructor to go over progress in the course.

Qualifications

Anyone with experience in TAing or being a reader in the disciplines of religious studies, history, philosophy, law, critical theory, gender studies, cultural studies, anthropology or related fields. I prefer someone pursuing a graduate degree in these or related fields.

TA must have attended the CEE's campus-wide TA orientation.

In 2023, HPRS is selecting up to 40 doctoral students who are beginning their second year in fall 2023 and do not expect to graduate before spring/summer 2026. Registration for 2023 HPRS webinar is available now and you can [register](#) here.

HPRS is a leadership opportunity for doctoral students from historically marginalized backgrounds and underrepresented populations across a wide range of disciplines—[from economics to political science to social work to psychology](#)—who want to apply their research to inform and influence policy in ways that advance health equity. Applicants are typically in their first year of doctoral program studies now (during fall 2022) and must be starting their second year of doctoral studies in fall 2023.

Eligibility:

- U.S. citizens, permanent residents, or individuals granted Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (“DACA”) status by the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services at the time of application are eligible
- Full-time doctoral students, starting their second year of studies in fall 2023, who will have at least three years of doctoral study remaining as of September 2023.
- From historically marginalized backgrounds and/or populations underrepresented in specific doctoral disciplines. Examples of eligible individuals include, but are not limited to: first-generation college graduates; individuals from lower socioeconomic backgrounds; individuals from communities of color; and individuals with disabilities.
- Pursuing a research-focused discipline that can advance a Culture of Health.
- Interested in health policy and interdisciplinary approaches.

Scholars:

- Participate in policy and leadership development trainings and coursework via online seminars and courses.
- Receive an annual award of up to \$30,000 for up to four years or until they complete their doctoral program (whichever is sooner).
- Receive training in health equity, the policy process, leadership, communication, implementation, and dissemination.
- Continue learning and working from their home institutions.
- Establish and strengthen professional ties to public health and policy leaders.
- Be eligible for a competitive dissertation grant of up to \$10,000.
