Invest in your future with an NIH F Award.

The NIH F-series awards help prepare individuals for careers in biomedical, behavioral, social, and clinical research. There are F awards for dual-degree students (F30), for Ph.D.s (F31), and for postdoctoral scholars (F32).

The F Award Writing Workshop is a hands-on workshop for pre- and postdoctoral scholars wanting to apply for an individual National Research Service Award Fellowship for submission to the NIH. (Priority registration will be given to cancer-focused scholars.)

At the end of the workshop, participants will have a completed, well-reviewed application ready for submission to the NIH.
