Are you interested in career diversity and learning about what opportunities exist for graduate students in K-12 education? This session, led by Professors for the Future Fellow Daniel Castaneda, features a panel of three PhDs who work in the California Subject Matter Project. Each, respectively, works in the California Science Project, the California Writing Project, and the California History-Social Science Project. These representatives will discuss how their graduate training prepared them for their current positions and how their work impacts K-12 education. This is the second of three workshops, introducing graduate students and postdoctoral scholars to the California Subject Matter Project (CSMP), which connects K-12 teachers and university faculty to improve K-12 instruction.
